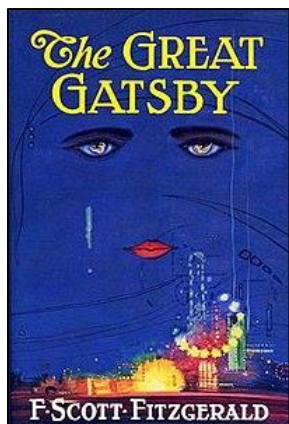


## Callahan Learning & Cultural Programs For ages 55+



### F. Scott Fitzgerald: His Life and Works

Francis Scott Key Fitzgerald achieved popular success, fame and fortune during his lifetime but did not receive critical acclaim until after his death. Now widely regarded as one of the greatest American writers of the 20th century, we will analyze his flamboyant life, the Jazz Age of which he was a glittering part, and his brilliant writing style. Presenter Dr. Larry Lowenthal received an M.A. in English Literature from Northwestern and Ph.D. from NYU. He taught at several colleges in the U.S. and Israel.
