COVID-19 UPDATE

Ten Additional Residents Test Positive, and nine More have Recovered,

City Learns of Three New COVID-19 Related Fatalities

Reminder: May 19 Zoom Community Hour Focused on Laying the Foundation for Reopening the City

- **Ten additional residents test positive for COVID-19, nine more people have recovered from the virus, and the City learns of three new COVID-19-related fatalities:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is now 1,456. Today's fatalities are connected to nursing homes. With 583 cases recovered and 80 fatalities, Framingham currently has 793 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 244 residents in quarantine.
