COVID-19 UPDATE

**Since June 12, Five Additional Residents Test Positive,
Seven More have Recovered, and City Learns of Two New Fatalities Related to COVID-19;**
*Health Department Distributes Demographic COVID-19 Data, Including Framingham-specific COVID-19
Testing Data Released by the State for the First Time;*

- **Since June 12, five additional residents test positive, seven more have recovered, and City learns of two new fatalities related to COVID-19:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 1,705. With 1,339 cases recovered and 103 fatalities, Framingham currently has 263 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Framingham Health Department currently is following 109 residents in quarantine.
- **The City's Department of Public Health distributes demographic COVID-19 data every Monday on all confirmed Cases in Framingham since March 1, 2020:** Data includes information about confirmed cases by age, gender, race/ethnicity, fatalities, nursing homes, and residential settings, as well as Framingham-specific testing data released by the State for the first time. The new data from the State showed that for the first time since early March, Framingham's positive test rate has lowered to less than 5% (pages 5 and 6). Meaning, less than 5% of residents who got tested were tested positive. Almost 400 residents were tested last week, and only seven tested positive (1.73%). Reference today's data release [here](#).
