## \*COVID-19 UPDATE\*

Since Friday, June 26, Seven Residents Have Tested Positive, Three More have Recovered, and City Learns of One New Fatality Related to COVID-19;

Health Department Distributes Demographic COVID-19 Data; Reminder: Community Hour Tuesday at 5 p.m., Focused on Building an Anti-racist Village with Community, Classrooms, College, and Clergy

- Since Friday, June 26, seven residents have tested positive, three more have recovered, and City learns of one new fatality related to COVID-19: The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 1,732. With 1,416 cases recovered and 114 fatalities, Framingham currently has 202 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Health Department is following 94 residents in quarantine.
- The City's Department of Public Health distributes demographic COVID-19 data every Monday
  on all confirmed Cases in Framingham since March 1, 2020: Data includes information about
  confirmed cases by age, gender, race/ethnicity, fatalities, nursing homes, and residential
