Today the City Honors the 19th Anniversary of 9/11 and the 17 People with Ties to Framingham who Lost their Lives with a Televised Remembrance Ceremony at 5 p.m.

Framingham, MA: Today the City of Framingham will host a televised remembrance ceremony (recorded earlier in the day) on the [Framingham Government Channel](#) available on Comcast 99, RCN 13/HD613, and Verizon 42 at 5 p.m. for the nineteenth anniversary of those who lost their lives in the events of September 11, 2001, including the 17 people with ties to Framingham.

The ceremony will include a presentation of colors by the Framingham Color Guard, a reading of the names on the memorial, a wreath placing, and the playing of Taps by the Framingham Police Department.

The 17 people with ties to the City include Neilie Heffernan Casey, Barbara Keating, Linda George, Lisa Fenn Gordenstein, Meta Fuller Waller, Laura Lee Morabito, Tara Shea Creamer, Charlie Murphy, Paige Farley Hackel, Judith Larocque, Todd Hill, Christine Barbuto, Susan Mackay, Herbert W. Homer, John J. Wenkus, Robin Kaplan, and Darin H. Pontell.

“Due to COVID-19, we are unable to gather as a community to remember this solemn occasion,” said Mayor Yvonne M. Spicer. “However, we will never forget the loss of the 2,977 lives – 17 of which were our own - resulting from the attacks 19 years ago. Today we pay tribute to the individuals who were injured or lost their lives, our brave first-responders who risked their lives to save others, and our armed forces who continue to defend freedom.”
