## **\*COVID-19 UPDATE\***

**Since Wednesday, 27 Residents have Tested Positive, 34 More have Recovered, and City Learns of Two New Fatalities Associated with COVID-19;**

*Community Outreach Teams in Framingham this Weekend;*

*Framingham's Loring Arena Complying with New State Executive Order Prohibiting Indoor Ice Rinks and Ice Skating Facilities from Hosting Games, Practices, or Other On-Ice Hockey or Skating Activities*

- **Since Wednesday, 27 residents have tested positive, 34 more have recovered, and the City learns of two new fatalities associated with COVID-19:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 2,525. With 2,211 recovered and 144 fatalities, Framingham currently has 170 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Health Department is following 116 residents in quarantine.
- **Framingham's Loring Arena complying with new state executive order prohibiting indoor ice rinks and ice-skating facilities from hosting games, practices, or any other on-ice hockey or skating activities beginning at 5 p.m. today through 12:01 a.m. November 7, 2020:** The order does not apply to activities of professional or collegiate interscholastic hockey and skating programs. Only professional and collegiate interscholastic hockey and skating programs may conduct on-ice activities during this time. View information about the order [here](#).
