**\*COVID-19 UPDATE\***

**Since Wednesday, 72 Residents have Tested Positive, 28 More have Recovered, and City Learns of Three New Fatalities Associated with COVID-19;**

*Reminder: Stop the Spread COVID-19 Drive-through Testing at TJX Companies, Inc., and Walk-up Testing at South Middlesex Opportunity Council Available Today*

- **Since Wednesday, 72 residents have tested positive, 28 more have recovered, and the City learns of three new fatalities associated with COVID-19:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 3,290. With 2,695 recovered and 158 fatalities, Framingham currently has 437 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Health Department is following 253 residents in quarantine.
- **Reminder: Stop the Spread COVID-19 Drive-through Testing at TJX and Walk-up Testing at South Middlesex Opportunity Council (SMOC) Available Today:**
  - **TJX Companies, Inc.: 770 Cochituate Road, Framingham, MA 01701 (entrance to the testing site is on Speen Street near the Mass Pike exit ramp overpass)**
    - Friday, November 27: 10 a.m.-2 p.m. (regular hours)
    - Saturday, November 28: 10 a.m.-2 p.m. (regular hours)
  - **SMOC: 7 Bishop Street, Framingham, MA 01702**
    - Friday, November 27: 3-6 p.m. (regular hours)
    - Per the usual schedule, walk-up testing is not open Saturdays

The State's free testing program is available on a "first-come-first-served basis" and access is not guaranteed. Once site capacity is reached, police on duty will prevent access until people walking up or those in cars have completed testing.

If you have insurance, have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or have symptoms, and want to use paid testing facilities, you can be tested at many paid testing facilities across the state.
