COVID-19 UPDATE

Since Wednesday, 72 Residents have Tested Positive, and 20 More have Recovered from COVID-19; Recipients of COVID-19 Dose One vaccine at the February 13 Framingham Public Health Department Clinic at Keefe Tech to be Invited to Make an Appointment for Dose 2; Community Hour Tues., March 2: Join us to Kick off Women's History Month and Learn about the Contributions of Women to Framingham

- **Since Wednesday, 72 residents have tested positive, and 20 more have recovered from COVID-19:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 6,794. With 5,342 recovered and 225 fatalities, Framingham currently has 1,227 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Health Department is following 467 residents in quarantine.
- **Recipients of COVID-19 dose one vaccine at the February 13 Framingham Public Health Department clinic at Keefe Tech to be invited to make an appointment for Dose 2:** Beginning Monday, March 1, those individuals who received dose one of the COVID-19 Moderna vaccine on February 13 will be contacted to make an appointment for a private dose two clinic tentatively planned for Saturday, March 13, at Keefe Tech. **FOR FURTHER EMPHASIS: This is a dose two clinic only, and it is only for those who received dose one on February 13 at Keefe Tech. No additional vaccinations, including companion vaccinations, will be available.** Because receipt of the vaccine is fluid, the second dose clinic's date **is tentative and subject to change.** The exact dosing date of the second vaccine is not critical as long as a minimum of 28 days has passed since dose one of the Moderna vaccine. **If the date of the private, second dose clinic changes, those who have appointments will be informed.**
