COVID-19 UPDATE

Since Wednesday, 53 Residents have Tested Positive, and 62 More have Recovered from COVID-19;

*A Message from Parks and Recreation about Tonight's Framingham High School Football Game;
Community Hour Wednesday, April 14, at 5 p.m. – Continuing the Dialogue about the American Rescue
Plan and What Implications it Has for Framingham*

- **Since Wednesday, 53 residents have tested positive, and 62 more have recovered from COVID-19:** The number of people in the City who have tested positive for COVID-19 is 7,794. With 6,091 recovered and 241 fatalities, Framingham currently has 1,462 active cases. The Framingham Health Department contacts the people who were potentially exposed and the owners of the businesses or places of employment where the potential exposures occurred to inform and counsel them on next steps (contact tracing). In addition to the active cases, the Health Department is following 599 residents in quarantine.
- **A Message from Parks and Recreation about Tonight's Framingham High School Football Game:** In anticipation of tonight's Framingham High School football game at Bowditch Stadium, the City of Framingham would like to provide a couple of reminders and an update. **Due to attendance restrictions, the game will only be open to parents/guardians of football players who have pre-registered. At this time, pre-registration has ended. If you have not pre-registered, you will not be admitted into the event.** The game will be streamed online at 5 p.m. by the Framingham Gridiron club, which can be viewed at:

For those who will be attending, you will be required to complete a mandatory pre-screening through a QR code. The QR code will be posted at the entrance to the stadium. Please follow the COVID restrictions in place at Bowditch, including socially distanced seating and mandatory masks at all times. Additional restrictions will be posted throughout the stadium. **If you are feeling sick or have been in contact with someone with COVID-19, do not attend the event.**
